In all the fields he works in, Charan loves to accept challenges and approaches the making with a "what if ... " attitude. Charan specializes in creating art yarns with textures, using traditional spinning techniques and pushing them an extra step to create unique yarns.



Charan Sachar lived in India for a significant part of his life where his mother ran a boutique designing clothes for brides and bridesmaids. The designs, colors, fabrics and embroidery he came across then have a strong impact on his work now.

Charan will share his journey starting as a software engineer, then textile artist and potter, and into all of his creative fields.

Susan DuBois; Owner <u>Treenway</u> <u>Silks</u>. Treenway Silks was founded in 1997 by Karen Selk and Terry Nelson. After 34 years, they decided to sell the business so they could spend more time traveling, writing a book, etc. On August 1, 2011, they sold the business to Susan



Du Bois and Richard Yabunaka. And they've been living inside a rainbow ever since!

Susan is experienced both in business and in the fiber arts. Her business experience includes 25 years in direct response marketing and financial analysis/accounting, plus she is a licensed CPA and holds three advanced degrees (MBA, MS-Accounting and MS-Marketing). Susan weaves, dyes, embroiders (she has taught silk ribbon embroidery), spins a little, and has dabbled in paper-making and felting.

Day Presentation: Wild Silks from India—Cocoons, Mawata Cakes, Combed Tops/Slivers and Yarns

Most of us are familiar with silk from the Bombyx mori silk worm...aka "bombyx silk" or "mulberry silk." Did you know there are also different kinds of wild silkworms that produce cocoons and beautiful silk? These wild silks from India can be naturally white, creamy, different shades of gold and even a brownish color. Come learn about these and see/touch these silks in person. There will be a pop up shop available.

Evening Presentation: Weaving with Silk—a show and tell of 2Skeins=2Scarves & weaving kits for Rigid Heddle and 4 or more shafts

Sometimes weaving your first silk project can be a bit daunting. A great place to start is with Treenway Silks' 2 skeins = 2 scarves free drafts. Come see our 12-year collections of hand-woven silk scarves and be inspired to dress your loom with silk. I'll cover a few tips and tricks for handling a silk skein, too. There will be a pop up shop available.

Deborah Silver

Split Shed Weaving - Multiple Structures Using a Straight Threading

May 10, 11, and 12, 2024

9:30am-4:00pm

Workshop fee: \$240 Material fee: bring \$15 (cash or card) to the workshop.

In-Person workshop

Break out of blocks with split-shed weaving. Weave curves and blend colors using continuous wefts on a 4-shaft loom with no special equipment. In this workshop, students will create multiple combinations of weave structures using only four shafts and a straight threading. Only tie-ups and treadling are changed between samples. Most of these combinations would normally require a minimum of eight shafts. Students will experiment with combinations of twills, summer and winter, double weave, Han damask, taqueté and more!

Prerequisites/Experience: Ability to warp and weave a 4 shaft fabric

Equipment/Materials: Directions for "homework" will be provided 45 days in advance. Bring loom and the shuttles, bobbins and tools.

As 2023 draws to a close, I would like to thank you for your support of WARP this year. Through the incredible dedication of our board members, volunteers, and the support of our membership, we have been able to expand our impact in textile communities worldwide. Thank you for being a WARP member!

In the past year, we:

Gave 20 development & emergency relief grants to artisan communities in 10 countries, totaling \$16,928.

• Hosted over 40 presenters from artisan communities worldwide during our monthly panel discussions and fireside chats, and shared these virtual programs with over 2,000 people in at least 25 countries.

 Held our first in-person Annual Meeting since pre-pandemic, engaging the local Cleveland/Kent community in Ohio, and broadcasting presentations on Zoom so those unable to attend in person could join.

• Welcomed five scholarship recipients to our Annual Meeting from Argentina, Guatemala, and the United States.

• Held our first members exhibition at Kent State University's Downtown Gallery, showcasing a diversity of artistic creations and traditions from WARP members from Argentina, Ghana, Guatemala, India, Laos, Lebanon, Mexico, Morocco, Uganda, the United States, and more.

• Published four newsletters and a monthly blog post which powerfully document the stories of our members' work in textile arts communities around the world.

• Updated our Artisan Direct Connect to include 80 listings of WARP member organizations. The ADC is a directory of resources offered by our members, including retail & wholesale sales, consulting services, and textile tours.

• Conducted a rebranding campaign resulting in the launch of our new website, making WARP's resources more accessible.

As I reflect on the year and our organization, I am grateful to all of our WARP members who volunteer valuable time and resources to make our work possible. I am grateful to WARP's Board of Directors who are engaged and committed to our mission of creating a globally connected textile community. And most of all, I am grateful to the entire WARP community for your tireless dedication to improving the lives of textile artisans worldwide.

\$25 registration for Young Adult CWD Scholarships

The Handweavers Guild of Boulder was the organizer of the 2022 Colorado Weavers Day conference. Due to Covid, this was a virtual event. During discussions, a theme emerged: how to get younger people involved in guilds and how to encourage attendance of young adults to Colorado Weavers Day. The 2022 CWD committee is responding to this need by using leftover funds from the 2022 conference to underwrite attendance for young adults to the 2024 conference. There are sufficient funds to sponsor partial scholarships for 30 individuals 26 and younger. Scholarship will reduce the cost of a full-price ticket to \$25. Please let qualifying young adults know about this scholarship. They will just register as usual and check the box that says "young adult". Additionally, Rocky Mountain Weavers Guild is sponsoring reduced student tickets for the same \$25 cost. So, if you know a student who would like to attend CWD 2024, please encourage them to apply for this scholarship as well.


